

ADVANCES IN COMPUTER CHESS 4

London, England

16-17 April 1984

The conference on "Advances in Computer Chess 4" will be held in London, England. It is the fourth in a series of international conferences specifically about Computer Chess that have been held at three-year intervals. Contributions are invited from authors who have new results, or ongoing work, to report on any aspect of Computer Chess or related theory.

(It would be helpful to the organisers if any potential authors who feel able to, would notify their intention to submit a paper as soon as possible, giving a title or summary.)

At the time of writing, the list of probable speakers already includes Dr. Hans Berliner and other leading figures in the study of computer chess. It is intended to accompany the technical papers by a chess event involving strong computers and humans.

Accommodation at the conference site is available for the nights of 15, 16 & 17 April. Alternatively, Brunel University is reachable by the underground network from central London (about 40 mins.). Registration will cost (roughly) of the order of £ 30.-- (thirty UK pounds) and rooms £ 10.-- (ten UK pounds) per night, but these figures are offered as a rough guide only and the actual cost may be slightly higher (or lower for student registrations).
