Presentation of Medal

Professor Silberberg, please accept our sincere congratulations on your receiving the Poiseuille Gold Medal for 1981.

The Medal, of 18 carat gold, has on one side, in relief, a portrait of Jean-Leonard-Marie Poiseuille, the French physician and physiologist, who can be rightly called the first biorheologist. The portrait was drawn by the Icelandic artist Nina Tryggvadottir from a photograph in the Archives of the Academie de Medicine in Paris, France. The signature of Poiseuille was also cast in relief. Surrounding the portrait, it reads: JEAN-LEONARD-MARIE-POISEUILLE.

The citation, engraved on the back side of the Model reads:


