GOLD MEDAL AWARD TO RICHARD SKALAK

It gives me great pleasure to present on behalf of the International Society of Biorheology the Jean-Léonard-Marie Poiseuille Gold Medal to our friend and colleague Richard Skalak.

The Poiseuille Gold Medal is the highest Award of our Society. Richard Skalak is its ninth Awardee.

The front side of the medal shows a portrait of Jean-Léonard-Marie Poiseuille (1797-1869), designed by the late Icelandic artist Nina Tryggvadottir in 1966.



On the back of the Medal, the engraved citation reads:
