In 1980 Professor Siegfried Witte together with Professor Alfred Copley and in cooperation with a group of active colleagues, launched the journal "Clinical Hemorheology, A companion Journal of Biorheology" at Pergamon Press. The journal has undergone continual development. In 1993 Professor Jean François Stoltz (Vandoeuvre les Nancy, France) joined the team as second Editor-in-Chief, and the journal was given a subtitle: "An international journal on Blood Flow, Vessel Wall, Interstitium: Transport and Interactions". When Siegfried Witte decided to retire as Editor-in-Chief the journal was still of utmost importance to him so the choice of successors concerned him greatly. Only after this had been taken care of in a way that was acceptable to both Al Copley and himself was he able to set his mind at rest.
