The Board of the ICCA is happy to honour the memory of Professor Gaetano Salvatore of the University of Naples, Italy, by offering a grant of US \$ 5,000 to an excellent student who finished a research thesis / project in 1997 in the field of algorithms for selective search. Professor Gaetano Salvatore died prematurely in July 1997. He was an outstanding pathologist, President of the Zoological Station "A. Dohrn", former Dean of the Faculty of Medicine of the University of Naples, member of the Italian Accademia dei Lincei, a Fogarty Scholarship recipient, and a very enthusiastic member of the ICCA. The grant has been initiated by Dr Marisa Salvatore, Professor Salvatore's wife, and Drs Francesco and Mauro Guarracino, close friends of his, who all live in Naples.

Students can apply for the grant, or can be recommended by their professors, by submitting a contribution in the field of *algorithms for selective search* to the *ICCA Journal*. The Board of the ICCA will, in cooperation with Mr. Guarracino, decide on the best contribution. The winner will be announced in the 1998 June issue of the *ICCA Journal*.
