The IPCC report 2021 is just out and it has clearly pointed out that human activity is impacting the climate in unprecedented and irreversible ways. It warns us of increasingly extreme heatwaves, forest fires, droughts and flooding, and observes that the temperature limit set is broken in just over a decade. The UN Chief also observed that "is a code red for humanity", but the scientific community has hope that catastrophe can be avoided if the world acts fast.
