# Information for authors

## 1. Aims and Scope

This Journal is published for the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (ECE). A Principal Subsidiary Body of the ECE, the Conference of European Statisticians has been working for almost 30 years on the full range of problems of concern to national statistical services. The Conference, composed of the heads of national statistical offices within the ECE region – which comprises all of Europe and North America – offers an impressive record of work accomplished.

One of the major achievements of the Conference is the promotion of international comparability of actual national data through the harmonization of statistical subject-matter concepts or nomenclatures. Others relate to better insight into organizational and methodological problems with which national statistical offices are faced. International meetings organized by the Conference provide opportunities for in-depth discussions of organizational models or methodological solutions.

The aim of this Journal is threefold:

- (i) to inform the professional world of statisticians, whether involved with theoretical or practical problems, of the work of the Conference;
- (ii) to establish a forum for critical discussion of the entire range of problems organizational, methodological, analytical or conceptual facing statistical services; and thereby

The Statistical Journal of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe publishes articles that have a recognizable link to the work programme of the Conference. The Journal covers the Conference's work programme, which is composed of five major areas:

- (1) Regional statistical co-operation, namely statistical work carried out by the ECE;
- (2) Organization and operation of statistical services, including, for example, use of electronic data processing in statistical services; general organization; and general methodology;
- (3) Development and harmonization of economic statistics, such as national accounts and balance international comparisons; correspondence between international and standard classifications of economic activities, goods and services; and statistical information in selected areas like agriculture, energy, science and technology;
- (4) Development and harmonization of social and demographic statistics, including, among other things, elaboration of a comprehensive framework for social and demographic statistics; population and housing censuses; nomenclatures and conceptual developments in individual fields such as manpower, education, culture, health, housing and migration; and
- (5) Developmental and harmonization of environment and related statistics, concerning such questions as frameworks for environment statistics; environmental indicators; concepts and nomenclatures in individual fields such as land use, water use, water quality, air quality, fauna and flora.

#### 2. Manuscripts

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- 1. Manuscripts must be written in English. Authors whose native language is not English are recommended to seek the advice of a native English speaker, if possible, before submitting their manuscripts.
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- 3. Manuscripts should be typed on one side of the paper only, with wide margins and double spacing throughout, including the abstract, footnotes and references; this leaves room for editorial instructions to the typesetter. Every page of the manuscript, including the title page, references, tables, etc., should be numbered in the upper right-hand corner. However, in the text no reference should be made to page numbers; if necessary, one may refer to sections. Underline words that should be in italics, but try to avoid the excessive use of italics.

- 4. Manuscripts should be organized in the following order:
- Title page
- Introduction
- Body of text (divided by subheadings)
- Conclusion
- Acknowledgements
- References
- Tables
- Figure captions

Any information concerning research grants, etc., should be included in the acknowledgement section preceding the references.
