

Forthcoming meetings convened by the Conference of European Statisticians

Working Party on national accounts and balances (Geneva, 16–19 May 1989)

The Working Party will consider the links between the revised version of the System of National Accounts (SNA) and the System of Balances of the National Economy (MPS).

Thirty-seventh plenary session of the Conference of European Statisticians (Geneva, 12–16 June 1989)

The Conference will discuss the possibilities of enhancing the informative role of statistics through comprehensive analysis and interpretation of data, and consider the use of micro-computers in statistical services. It will also review its recent activities, and revise and update its programme of work.

Statistics of air quality (Geneva, 4–6 September 1989)

The meeting is convened for the purpose of discussing the final version of an ECE Standard International Classification of Ambient Air Pollution. It comes in the early phase of the recently adopted programme of work of the Conference in the field of environment statistics. In this initial phase, the existing draft international standard classifications will be reviewed and, if possible, finalized, before the next Compendium of ECE Environment Statistics will be compiled (scheduled for publication early in 1991).

Work session on specific methodological issues of environment statistics (Budapest, Hungary, 8–13 September 1989)

The Hungarian Government invited the annual work session 1989 on this subject. According to the proposed agenda for the meeting, the session will discuss statistics on environmental aspects of human settlements, linkage problems between environ-

ment and other statistics (focusing on social and demographic statistics and on linkage through land information), and quality control and assessment of environment statistics.

Work session on the distribution of income of households (Geneva, 25–27 September 1989)

The session will consider the present stage of work on statistics on the distribution of income of households and main directions of future developments as well as the results of bilateral comparisons of distribution of income.
